It's Getting to Be That Time of Year Again

We've had a few nice warm days and many of us are itching

to work in our gardens and plant our annual flowers.

BUT WAIT.....in the last few days, parts of Minnesota received over ten inches of snow!!! Take advantage of these nice day and clean out your flower beds, but you may want to wait a little longer to plant those annual flowers.

It's also very discouraging when your flowers become tasty snacks for the deer. Cornell University has come up with a list of flowers that the deer rarely or seldom eat. Here is a partial listing:

Lupins, sedum, yarrow, astilbe, coneflower, lamb's ear, black-eyed susans, daffodils, foxglove, evening primrose, peony, poppies, joeye weed, marigolds, dusty miller, snap dragons, bee balm and queen-of-the-prairie.

There are many products on the market that help deter the deer - many have to be reapplied after rain and some home remedies include rotten eggs. Just remember not to place those home remedies near your house.

Unfortunately, no plant or flower is totally safe from the deer - if they are hungry, they will eat!!!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

New York State has a ban on residential brush burning in effect until at least May 15th.

“Violators of the open burning state regulation are subject to both criminal and civil enforcement actions, with a minimum fine of \$500 for a first offense.”

But did you know?

- Burning leaves is banned in New York State. You are encouraged to compost leaves.
- Burning household trash in burn barrels or piles is illegal. Again, recycle as much as possible.
- Hamilton County requires burn permits.
- In towns with a population of less than 20,000, you may burn tree limbs with attached leaves. Limbs must be less than 6” in diameter and 8 feet in length. (However, this is not allowed during the brush burning ban and you must have a burn permit.)
